I think Purim might have too much going on. There are the 4 special mitzvot: 1-Mikra Megillah/Reading the Megillah; 2-Seudat Mitzvah- eating a special festive meal; 3-Sending Mishloach Manot/gift-packages to friends; 4-Mattanot l'Evyonim/giving charity to the poor. Of course, there's also dressing up, blurring the line

between Mordechai and Haman, and the general merriment and joy that's associated with Purim. For a very short holiday, there's almost too much to do!

In fact, you might say that Purim has almost a manic quality to it. Between all of the special mitzvot and requirements, there's so much to accomplish in so few hours. In fact, one of the reasons the special festive is usually held in the afternoon instead of the morning is because the assumption is that we'll be so busy schlepping around delivering *mishloach manot* that we wouldn't have time to have the meal any earlier.

The wide ranging set of holiday activities and mitzvot seem designed to have us pulled in a million different directions. There are two schools of thought on how to 'succeed' at Purim: either you have a clear schedule and minute-by-minute plan, to efficiently jump from one activity to the next; or you just kind of go with the flow, and move through the holiday with a frenzied sense of excitement. More often than not, it's impossible not to do a little bit of both.

Perhaps that's precisely the experience of the heroes of the Purim story. Mordechai and Esther simultaneously create a thorough, thoughtful, and detailed plan. Yet they also have to roll with the punches and take whatever opportunity comes their way to save the Jewish people. Concrete thinking collides perfectly with a strategic nimbleness born of necessity. The result is success, safety, and joy for the Jewish People.

May we all learn and live out the lessons of Purim, to do so much in so little time, to craft great plans and go with the flow, and with that perspective work to create everlasting joy and safety for us, and for the Jewish People worldwide.

The Miracle of Purim is back again!!

As we approach the holiday of Purim, I ask myself, how can we be joyful and celebrate the holiday when our People are going through a devastating time? How can we rejoice when there is a war of survival in Israel? How can we feel the miracle of salvation in our current generation when our enemies outnumber us and want our destruction? And, how can we turn the complexity of our current reality into a decisive and faithful victory against Amalek?

Anyone who is familiar with Jewish history can see that the Purim narrative is not exclusive to Megillat Esther, but is, in fact, a recurring theme of Jewish survival. The fact that Judaism and the Jewish people have survived for 3300 years is, in and of itself, miraculous. More significantly, our survival is not merely physical, but cultural as well. Countless antisemites have attempted to eradicate us physically and culturally – missionaries have tried to convert us, while others tried to tempt us into assimilation, but today we are more united, than ever, and our strength is rooted in our rich Jewish heritage. Twice in history, we were brutally exiled from our Land, and twice we returned to it, first, after the Babylonian Exile and in 1948 with the transcendent birth of the State of Israel that led to the incredible ingathering of Jews from all every corner of the world finally coming Home.

The story of Purim sets the stage as the prototype of Jewish survival. The Divine intervention hidden in random events has ensured not only our survival, but also our prosperity despite continual threats to our existence, even in our own land.

REPORT FROM SEARCH COMMITTEE

The Search Committee has renewed its efforts to find the best new hires for Temple Israel. As a reconstituted group late in 2023, we expanded and now include the tasks of identifying both a second clergy as well as a Director of Youth Education and Programming.

As of this writing, we have received 10 applications for the second clergy, conducted several first and second round interviews and held one on-site visit over the weekend of February 2nd to 4th, which was very lovely. The visiting Cantor was extremely impressed by the energy, commitment, spirituality, dedication and musicality of our community and many members had an opportunity to interact with him. We are still early in the process and continue to receive applications, screen and interview candidates.

The Director of Youth Ed and Programming role is an extremely important function at Temple Israel and any candidate will build on the foundation that has been established over the past few years. This role leads the Religious School, family holiday programs for young families, and mentors the talented educators that we are blessed to have. The search is newly under way and we have received a couple of applications. We will be having a first round interview with an applicant before the end of February.

We want to thank the members of the committee for their tireless work, kindness, insight, and deep commitment to ensuring that we will not settle for anything but the best for our Temple Israel community.

INCLUSION COMMITTEE



The Inclusion Committee has recently welcomed three new members: Daniela Rubinstein, Jeremy Slosberg, and Phil Bernstein, and we've also thanked Stef Wood, who has been an active member for several years. The Committee have been working on several areas in recent months. First, we have been continuing our work on accessibility, collaborating with the House Committee and professional staff to identify ways to make the facility more accessible and accommodating for people with mobility, sensory, physical, and brain health challenges. If you have experienced obstacles or impediments in the building, or ideas about improving our signage or anything to make the building and grounds more welcoming, please reach out and let us know. In that vein, in February we sponsored the annual Disability Awareness Shabbat, focusing this year on the autism spectrum and ways in which affected people can take part in synagogue life.

We've been quite occupied with **interfaith matters**, working with Rabbi Fineberg, the Ritual Committee, and United Synagogue to prepare a ritual guidelines document for Temple Israel. The document, still under review, lays out boundaries for religious services and life-cycle observances, indicating our norms for Jews and non-Jews within the community. The goal is to clarify and demystify practices, so that anyone attending a service or life-cycle event knows what they may and may not do, and where to seek authoritative information and explanations.

As discussed in the prior issue of the *Luach* we've also been taking up the question of **membership** for non-Jewish partners in the community. Nationally, there has been a notable trend within USCJ congregations to include any people committed to raising Jewish families. Our congregational survey last year indicated support for the idea. Currently, the TI by-laws say that "The object of this Congregation shall be to sustain the Jewish faith." The by-laws go on to restrict membership to "Any person of the Jewish faith" and we are now at a moment in time to ask seriously whether that restriction best serves the primary mission of sustaining the Jewish faith. We are drafting some new by-law language to present to the Board and Congregation later in the spring.

On the subject of by-laws, in late January the Committee requested a change of status. Temple Israel has two types of committees: standing committees of the Board (e.g. Education, Ritual, Budget), whose chairs are Trustees of the Temple, and committees of the Congregation, which are not permanent. Inclusion has been a Committee of the Congregation. In view of the strategic importance of the value "And My House shall be a house of prayer for all people" (Isaiah 56:7), we've asked the Board to make Inclusion a standing committee. At the time of this writing, the Board discussion has not yet occurred.

Looking ahead, we will continue to team with other shul committees and arms to lower impediments to participation. This June we'll once again sponsor a Pride Shabbat observance. If you'd like to help with the plans or provide input, please send an email to <code>inclusion@tisharon.org</code>.

We're always interested in new volunteers and new ideas about ways to strengthen the TI community by addressing those obstacles, practices, and features that might keep people at a distance. If you have questions, suggestions, or want to join the committee, please reach out.
